While on the subject of orchards, you may soon see Ilias, our Orchard Lead, spraying our communal fruit trees – he will be using minimal doses. This is against fungal and bacterial disease.

- Managing the site shop and its stock (Sarah can still assist if wished)
- Keeping the website up-to-date
- Running projects – for example, our move to become incorporated, or to improve communal water harvesting on site
- Negotiating with members when there are problems
- Writing and editing communications – newsletter, annual report...

- Handling member requests for structures, new trees etc
- Keeping track of our assets and their maintenance
- Organising working parties and social events

Committee members meet once a month (day/time will be set once new committee in place next March) and all contribute to decisions on individual cases and general policy, running our social events, doing audits etc.

Although March seems a long way away, finding new volunteers now will help smooth handover. So if you have a bit of time to spare and skills to contribute or learn, please get in touch.
